## Course Objectives


- +Examine key issues in health care policy, the political currents affecting outcomes, and the ways in which advocates on all sides have assembled and communicated evidence to support specific arguments
- +Enhance skills in policy and/or political analysis
- +Obtain practical experience related to health care in government or with an advocacy organization

- + Design and carry out your own health policy research project (as part of a combined requirement for POL 108 and POL 196E)
- + Work 16-20 hours per week for a government, non-profit, or advocacy organization related to health or health care
